Open Memo to the VdC Community

Subject: Team Selection

I am both encouraged and challenged by the number of you who have signed up as wanting to serve on weekend #30! There are a few things that must remain in the forefront when choosing team members:

1. First and most important – this is God's team (not mine, not the Head Cook's, not the participants'). God needs to be given the opportunity to call who He wants on team.
2. When there is a co-ed team, we like to keep the number of males and females on team as close to even as possible. This means that only ½ of the normal number of folks called will be female, and ½ will be male. This cuts down drastically on the number of people who can serve on team, compared to when there are 2 weekends in a year.
3. Even if you really, really want to serve on team, and have put your name on one (or more) of the lists to be called for team, please do not be disappointed or disheartened if you are not called for team, as we can only have a limited number of folks on team, and God is doing the choosing!
4. If you really, really want to serve on team, and are not called for team, please consider being a part of Community – the more folks on that team, the less work for each one.
5. Whether or not you signed up to serve on team, please keep the weekend, the team, and the participants bathed in your prayers – pray for God's will to be done, and that the team will be able to discern and follow His lead.
6. Know that each of you is special, and you are cherished by our Lord, and by me.
