Grouping

ARE YOU GROUPING?

It seems that we are talking more and more about grouping! It is mentioned at every Ultreya, is a requirement for serving in the Rollo Room on team, and is an important part of being a sponsor. Why such a focus on grouping? From the turnouts at Ultreyas, and the information on the grouping sheets that have been turned in, less than 10% of our Christoistas are grouping.

According to our training in Servant School, the reason for the weekends is not to have more weekends, but to build communities through grouping that can reach into the world we live in and evangelize it for our Lord, Jesus Christ!

To quote different areas of Servant School:

“The goal of the group reunion is growth in friendship, growth in study of the Bible, growth in apostolic action, and growth in commitment.”

“The weekend experience is designed to make the pilgrim/candidates want to be witnesses for Christ and to live a life of evangelism. We cannot discover our gifts or minister to others in a vacuum. Reunion groups are very important in helping us follow Jesus. The reunion group is supposed to be a place where we are held accountable for what we do, a place where we receive encouragement and support, and a place where we encourage and support the other members of the group. We review our piety, study, and action on a regular basis. Reunion groups are small, grace-filled communities, and we need to feel this grace regularly in order to spread that grace through the way we live our own lives. The group reunion is a tool used by the Holy Spirit to help us live a life of grace in our environments.”

“When group reunion is lived, it becomes a Christian community affecting the world. What should distinguish Christians from others is our love of Christ and the joy and optimism that comes from knowing Him.”

“Our society is not conditioned to Christian community. No matter how well intentioned and devoted a person might be, it will always be difficult living out the Christian faith without the help, support, and contact of other Christians. The work of the Via de Cristo is helping Christians to become effective apostles and grow as saints. Via de Cristo believes that small friendship/accountability groups are building blocks for vital Christian community and for perseverance in the Christian life.”

“The reunion group is the backbone of our Via de Cristo. We all know that the weekend would become just a beautiful memory, ‘a mountain top experience’ and would soon fade into the past if we did not continue the weekend process through group reunion, ultreyas, team and other weekend participation. The intent of the weekend is to encourage pilgrim/candidates to maintain a Christian walk on a daily basis. We hope to help them to find their niche in their own church and community. We want them to continue their encounter with Christ and to be leaders in carrying the banner of Christ. We feel the way to accomplish this is through small close-knit groups. God intended that we have fellowship; and, from the very beginning of the church, this has been an important part of Christianity. The goal of the reunion group is to encourage each other to grow in faith and to lead a life balanced in piety, study, and action.”

My name is Ed Broestl and I worship at Faith Community Lutheran Church in Longmont, CO with my wife Diane. Diane and I have two grown sons, two wonderful daughters-in-law, and six grandchildren.

I entered the Cursillo community via Northern Virginia Walk to Emmaus #30 in May, 1989 where I sat at a rectangular table named Joy.

My Walk to Emmaus experience came as I was grappling with a decision to retire from the Air Force. Through my weekend, I came to know "the peace that passes all understanding." The community knew I was moving to Colorado later in 1989. They also knew there was not an Emmaus community in Colorado. They did everything they could to prepare me to start a Colorado community. God had other plans!

In the mid-1990's, a friend asked if I was familiar with Cursillo. We had a long conversation about starting a Lutheran expression in Colorado. The result - I was blessed to be part of the group that formed Colorado Via de Cristo. I attended my first NLS Annual Meeting in Milwaukee in 1998. The experience brought back so many memories of my Walk to Emmaus weekend.

I knew this was where I belonged. During the 2003 NLSAM, held in Columbus, OH, I discovered God calling me into Diaconal

Ministry. From January 2004 through June 2007, I completed the necessary course work at Gettysburg Lutheran Theological Seminary in Pennsylvania and was consecrated as a Diaconal Minister in December 2008. In September 2007, I began full-time Christian ministry as the Parish Associate and later as a called Diaconal Minister at Faith Community Lutheran Church. This experience once again affirmed the saying we all have heard: "God doesn't call the equipped...He equips the called!"

I am honored to serve as the President of the National Lutheran Secretariat. God has wondrous things in store for your Board. I am excited to see exactly what and how it will all come together.
