### *Tirosh Board*

The Tirosh Committee met on Saturday, April 21, 2012 at Mount Zion Lutheran Church. There were six enthusiastic members in attendance. There are six others who are interested in serving on the committee, and they will be contacted before our next meeting. Our first order of business was to decide when and where to have a Tirosh weekend. We will be checking with Tanque Verde Lutheran Church to see which of three tentative weekend dates might be available. In order to make the weekends accessible to as many youth as possible, and to avoid conflicts with school schedules, we are going to see if it would be possible to start the weekends at 6 PM on a Friday, and end around 6 PM on Sunday. We will be working on a basic schedule to see if all activities can fit into this time frame. Our goal is to be able to have a weekend in place, fully staffed, by early 2013.

The committee prayed over a list of names for those eligible to serve as Lay Directors for the weekend, and then voted on who to call. As soon as the dates are confirmed, the calls will begin.

### *New Lay Director*

My name is Bill Wardle. Recently, I was asked if I would accept the position of Lay Director for Southern Arizona Via de Cristo, thus filling the shoes of my predecessor Dorothy Mclean. Why would I accept such a position when I know how hard it would be to perform at Dorothy's level? Well, let's start by telling you a little about myself. My ancestry came to this country from England at the turn of the century. I grew up attending the Episcopal Church. I was baptized and confirmed into the Church of England at an early age and remained faithful by attending that church until I entered college. I attended three different colleges to obtain the degrees that were necessary for my specialty. While at Creighton University, I looked at Catholicism since it was a Jesuit school, but upon graduation I remained Protestant. Then, I entered the United States Air Force where I had several wonderful assignments i.e. the Air Force Academy in Colorado Springs, Colorado and Japan on two different tours and occasions. I was then assigned to the hospital at Davis Monthan Air Force Base in Tucson, Arizona. After five years on station, I retired from the Air Force and entered private practice in the Medical Square here in Tucson with a satellite office in Green Valley. During my Air Force career, where ever we were stationed, my wife, children and I attended church services on Base.

Surprisingly, most Air Force Chaplains where we were stationed were of the Lutheran faith. Three of my four children were baptized by these wonderful men who were serving in the military at the time. My forth child, Judith, her husband, and their young daughter were later baptized at Streams in the Desert Lutheran Church by Pastor Tom Dunham. What a wonderful event that was! Following retirement from the Air Force and private practice, I briefly attended St. Albans and St. Phillips of the Foothills Episcopal Churches but somehow was not completely comfortable with their message. I knew of the Lord for years but I just could not reconcile what I was thinking and feeling. A piece of the puzzle was still missing. About that time, I met a fellow who was attending Streams in the Desert Lutheran Church and he basically said to me "Come and see" and my wife, Barbara and I have been at Streams ever since. During our involvement at Streams, I became aware of a program called Southern Arizona Via de Cristo and I was anxious to attend. It turns out I went through Southern Arizona Via de Cristo #23 and my wife Barbara, attended Via de Cristo #24. I have often felt that I had accomplished a lot and attained many lofty goals in my life for which I seemed to have been taking all the credit. Now it became obvious – the Via de Cristo weekend had jolted me to my senses and I suddenly realized what a remarkable life God had chosen for me and my family. He did it!

Whether it was a combination of the events of the weekend or I had just received a "God Smack" - there it was! This was the missing piece of the puzzle I had yearned to find. Suddenly, I realized it wasn't me at all that was at the center of the universe, it was Him! I remember how as I sat on the edge of my cot in the gymnasium that night shedding a few tears, I suddenly felt my body being infused with love, kindness, and a willingness to be closer to Him, to serve Him, and to be a part of the Via de Cristo movement. Since then, I have had a busy 4<sup>th</sup> day serving in both Tirosh and Via de Cristo as a cook and in the Rollo Room. What a distinct pleasure it has been to serve on teams and to serve in my own church - Streams in the Desert Lutheran as Council President, Building and Grounds, and Stewardship. Just being in the service of the Lord gives me great pleasure and inner peace. This is why I have accepted the position of Lay Director for this year's weekend. I have asked the Lord to help me and to know my heart, and through Him, I know we all will have another great weekend!

### *Want to take a cruise?*

Back in March, I took a cruise to the Mexican Riviera, leaving out of San Diego, CA. Several members of Mt. Zion voiced their desire to be able to take a cruise, as well. I thought it might be fun to set a date, choose a cruise ship and destination, and

then open up the idea to everyone in the Via de Cristo community - just to see who really wants to take a cruise!

To that end, I have chosen Carnival Cruise Lines (they are the lowest priced, and most convenient); seven night cruise to the Mexican Riviera (Puerto Vallarta & Cabo San Lucas); leaving from Long Beach, CA (they no longer depart from San Diego); sailing Oct. 7 thru Oct. 14, 2012. Costs range from right around \$500 up to about \$700 per person, depending on the type of cabin and number of people in your party.

The cost of the cruise includes your cabin, which is cleaned/freshened twice each day, all meals and snacks, and entertainment. Shore excursions cost extra. They are a lot of fun, but not necessary. Sodas, alcohol, and gambling are also extra. There is a walking/jogging track, mini-golf, basketball, ping-pong, exercise machines, pools/hot tubs, and many other diversions - all included in the cost of the trip.

If we get enough interest, we could car-pool to Long Beach, splitting the cost of gas and parking. So far, there are 8 - 12 folks interested. That would involve 2 to 3 cars/vans for transportation.

A few tips: have at least 2 people in your group, but no more than 4 in a cabin. Inside cabins are small, so having 2 or 3 persons is best - 4 would get a bit crowded. If you want 4 in a cabin, I strongly suggest an outside cabin with a balcony - a bit more costly, but worth it.

### *Want to take a cruise?*

If there are just two of you traveling together, you might want to look at the “up and down” – a single bed with a single bunk – it comes in a room with a porthole, and looks really cute, and costs less! Regardless of the cabin size, there is only one bathroom – so plan on sharing with everyone in your cabin.

## Hosted by Colorado VdC of the Rockies

On behalf of the National Lutheran Secretariat and the Host Committee from Colorado, you are officially invited to attend the National Lutheran Secretariat Annual Meeting in Denver, CO, July 26 through July 29.

Those of you who attended the Annual Meeting in Charlotte, NC, will soon be receiving a letter from us with the registration enclosed. Additional forms will be available on the NLS web site [www.viadecristo.org](http://www.viadecristo.org). Also note that on the registration form there are options for an extra night's stay, as well as additional meals in the dining room. Be sure to include the cost for the extra night and meals with your total payment when you make your reservation.

Regis University in Denver will be the site of this year's annual meeting. Even though Regis is a small campus, you will be walking at a higher altitude. You will need to stay hydrated and use sunscreen lotion. We will be providing detailed information about the prevention of altitude sickness with the confirmation of your registrations. Transportation between buildings on campus will be limited. Walking provides the most direct route and we are encouraging people to walk as much as possible.

The dorm rooms are suites with the bathroom facilities in the middle and a sleeping room on either side. As in NC no more than four people will be sharing the bathroom facilities. Regis is a no smoking and no alcohol campus.

## From our NLS Vice President of Out Reach

### *Walk the Talk*

When we are asked to serve as a Team member of a Via de Cristo weekend, we need to examine ourselves and ask; am I living my *Fourth Day* in a way that others should emulate? We can't go serve on a Team and tell others that being in a Reunion Group is a critical part of the Fourth Day if we are not active in a Reunion Group ourselves. We can't tell people that study is a big part of strengthening their relationship with God, if we don't open the bible or read devotions to strengthen our own relationship with God. As many of you know, the NLS launched a Leadership Survey this past December. As of today, 572 people have responded to the survey. Early indications show that almost 50% of the people who responded are actively serving on Team and are not in a Reunion Group. This is not "Walking the Talk". I understand there are many reasons why people may not be in a Reunion Group, but if you elect to not seek out a Group and you elect to join team...you must not put yourself in a position of a hypocrite. I looked at the reasons why people are not in a reunion group and

what I surmise is that many started in a Reunion Group, then the group fizzled out and they never found another. The number one reason given as to why people are not in a Reunion Group is that they say they can't find a Reunion Group to join! I would love to find out if these same people attend an Ultreya and ask others about joining or starting a group. Since the number one reason why people are not in a Reunion Group is because they can't find one, it's time for us to *Walk the Talk*. We need to put ourselves out there and let people know that we are here for them. We need to step outside of the comfort zone of our own Reunion Group and be willing to start a new Group. Sure it may be awkward to start a group with people you don't know, but wasn't it awkward to meet the people around your Table Group for the first time on your weekend? Let God lead you. Let God help you find those who are looking for a Group to join. Let God help you

## *The Wheel Leading to The Way*

A Three-Part Article for the Conexiones Newsletter

*(Beginning with the November 2011 issue)*

“I am the Way, the Truth, and the Life.” *John 14:6* As I reflect on the theme of our 2011 National Lutheran Secretariat Annual Meeting, I am filled with gratitude for God’s gift of the Via de Cristo method of Christian renewal. We have all experienced that grace-filled weekend and are dedicated to continuing “The Essentials” so that others may know and live their Fourth Day, also. Through the power of the Holy Spirit, a learning process takes place during each weekend. One way to explore the effectiveness of the Via de Cristo method is to view it as a wheel, or a cycle, of learning. By progressing around that cycle, this series of articles will discuss the “why,” “what,” and “how” of adhering to Eduardo Bonnín’s Cursillo vision.

**Part 1:** Connecting Heads and Hearts through the Via de Cristo Method. It is fairly common to hear Cursillistas, or pilgrims, refer to the connection between head and heart that often occurs during or after a Via de Cristo weekend. Surrounded by visual, tangible evidence of God’s great love for us in

sending His only Son, Jesus Christ, and filled to overflowing with a new understanding of God’s grace, men and women, through the Holy Spirit’s power, are called to apostolic action as Christian leaders in their environments. So, why is it that the intellectual and spiritual aspects are drawn together so closely throughout a weekend? Created in God’s image, human beings have been blessed with the ability to learn, and each of us learns in his or her own unique way. There are those who are more creative and imaginative

while others look for the hands-on, practical applications of knowledge. Some have analytical strengths, and some learn best by teaching fellow learners. It is one of the gifts of the Via de Cristo method that the Essentials and the structure of a weekend address each learning style group. We will explore more specifics in the next issue of this newsletter. Allow me to close with a favorite quote of my great-aunt, Morella Mensing, who taught in Lutheran schools for over 50 years: “*Christian education is a happening in the heart.*”
