for them. If you listen carefully to those who witness about their weekend, you will hear something different from each person. This is what makes it hard to explain what Cursillo is all about to those who show interest or are curious about it.

Leadership training follows the weekend. It includes an explanation of both the structure and the philosophy of the Cursillo weekend, and brings to light what was experienced on the weekend. Information is given on how to sponsor someone to a weekend. Leadership training is a continuation of the building of a Christian community.

Serving on team is a natural next step. It is a huge commitment to God, to your family and to all the other team members called to serve with you. It is a commitment not to be taken lightly. Now you will put into action that which was stressed on your weekend: rely on God for direction, pray for guidance. You will be asked three questions: Are

you grouping? Do you attend Ultreyas regularly? Can you commit to attending all the team meetings? You will be given a schedule of the times, dates and places of team meetings (usually 6 - 8 of these) and the Eve of Dedication at the time you are called, and you will be expected to attend all team meetings. Absences are sometimes excused, for example, for emergencies, but this is at the discretion of the Rector/Rectora.

The time spent in team formation is used for learning what your role will be on the weekend, and for getting to know the other team members with whom you will share the weekend. It includes times of worship and of fellowship, the same things you will share with the participants as they experience their weekend. If a team member is absent from a meeting, a terrible void is felt by all team. Team

formation makes you part of what is happening and helps you understand how all the events of the weekend work together. This is the time you said yes to, the commitment you made when you were asked to be on team. It is vitally important that you honor your commitment and your team partners by attending each team meeting. Team meetings involve so much more than menu planning, palanca making and rollo practice!

Whether you are called to serve on team for a Cursillo Weekend, a Tirosh Weekend or in another way in your home church, do your service with a joyful heart,
